The Achievement of Excellence in Procurement award is designed to recognize organizational excellence in procurement. The award is achieved by those organizations that demonstrate excellence in procurement by obtaining a high score on a rating of standardized criteria. The program is designed to measure ***professionalism, productivity, innovation, e-procurement*** and ***leadership*** attributes of the procurement function.

The AEP is sponsored by the **Texas Public Purchasing Association (TxPPA)** along with the National Purchasing Institute (NPI), the California Association of Public Purchasing Officers (CAPPO), Florida Association of Public Purchasing Officers (FAPPO), the Institute of Supply Management (ISM), the National Institute of Governmental Purchasing (NIGP), the National Association of State Procurement Officials (NASPO), and the National Association of Educational Procurement (NAEP).

The AEP Committee is comprised of at least 2 members of the above mentioned organizations. As a sponsor of the AEP, TxPPA has two representatives on the AEP committee. Cyd Grimes, C.P.M., Travis County, and Cheryl Turney, C.P.M., City of College Station. Given the divergent backgrounds of committee members; local, state, and national influences are taken into account when establishing and refining award criteria. With few exceptions, committee members are certified and have many years experience in public sector purchasing. Accordingly, deliberations are made about best practices, benchmarking, recent trends, and proven techniques from all levels of government.

This year, for the first time, you may submit your application electronically online at www.npicconnection.com. The electronic submittal is an option for the 2009 application, but will be required in 2010.
